The Members may nominate an Alternate Director from time to time, in accordance with the Company's constitution.

Jamie Ryan resigned and was appointed as Alternate Director for Edward Dowse on 1 July 2021. Annette Watkins was appointed as Company Secretary on 15 December 2020.

Principal activities

The principal activity of the Company during the financial period is the coordinating of the Western Australia Container Deposit Scheme which commenced on 1 October 2020.

Objectives and performance

The Company was established to act as the Scheme Coordinator responsible to administer the Western Australia Container Deposit Scheme, which commenced on 1 October 2020. The Company was appointed as the Scheme Coordinator on 15 July 2019. The Company is a not-for-profit entity registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC).

The Company's vision for the Scheme is aligned with the objectives of the State as set out in the *Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery Amendment Act 2019*. The core objectives are:

- increasing the recovery and recycling of empty beverage containers;
- reducing the number of empty beverage containers that are disposed of as litter or to landfill;
- ensuring that first responsible suppliers of beverage products take product stewardship responsibility in relation to their beverage products;
- providing opportunities for social enterprise, and benefits for community organisations, through participation in the container deposit scheme;
- creating opportunities for employment;
- complementing existing collection and recycling activities for recyclable waste; and
- ensuring robust and transparent governance arrangements to ensure confidence in the Scheme for all stakeholders concerned.

The Company's performance is reviewed regularly by the Board against its Strategic Plan and budget.

Contributions on winding up

In the event of the Company being wound up, ordinary members are required to contribute a maximum of \$10 each. Honorary members are not required to contribute.

The total amount that members of the Company are liable to contribute if the Company is wound up is \$20, based on 2 current ordinary members.

Opinion



Notes to the financial statements
30 June 2022

Note 1. Reporting Entity

The Company is operating as a not-for-profit entity and the principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

New or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The Company has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

Basis of preparation

These general purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards - Simplified Disclosures issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB'), *the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 (Cth)* and associated regulations and the *Corporations Act 2001 (Cth)*, as appropriate for Not-for-profit oriented entities.

Historical cost convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, except for, where applicable, the revaluation of financial assets and liabilities at fair value through profit or loss, financial assets at fair value through other comprehensive income, investment properties, certain classes of property, plant and equipment and derivative financial instruments.

The financial statements are presented in Australian dollars, which is WA Return Recycle Renew Ltd.'s functional and presentation currency.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, which assumes that the Company will be able to continue trading, realise its assets and discharge its liabilities in the ordinary course of business for a period of at least 12 months from the date that these financial statements are approved.

Note 2. Significant accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out either in the respective notes or below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

Use of estimates and judgements

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised and in any future periods.

The estimate and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts assets and liabilities within the next financial year are:

Accrued expenses

Recognised amounts of direct scheme costs and related accrued expenses reflect management's best estimate of amounts owing to scheme participants that were not wholly substantiated by declarations of scheme participants at year end. These estimates are based on a number of critical underlying assumptions such as the volumes of containers submitted and processed through the scheme at a given time. Estimation uncertainties exist with regard to these items and variations in these assumptions may significantly impact the amount of direct scheme costs and accrued expenses.

Related parties

The Company does not consider its Members to be Related Parties under AASB 124, with no single party possessing control or significant influence over the Company. Key decisions of the Company are subject to special majority resolution under the Company's Constitution (requiring 75% majority), the *Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery Amendment Act 2019* provides a tightly defined scope of activities for the Company, and the Minister for Environment possesses extraordinary powers under the act including approval of Board Directors. All Directors nominated to the Company's Board are non-executive and are obliged to meet their fiduciary duties under the *Corporations Act 2001*.

Current and non-current classification

Assets and liabilities are presented in the statement of financial position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is classified as current when: it is either expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in the Company's normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting period; or the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period. All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current when: it is either expected to be settled in the Company's normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting period; or there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period. All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

Income tax

The income of the Company is exempt from Income tax pursuant to the provisions of subdivision 50-B of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 (Cth)* and the Company receives GST concessions under division 176 of *A New Tax System Act 1999 (Cth)* and is considered an FBT rebatable employer under section 123E of the *Fringe Benefits Tax Assessment Act 1986 (Cth)*.

Impairment of non-financial assets

Non-financial assets are reviewed for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount.

Recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value-in-use. The value-in-use is the present value of the estimated future cash flows relating to the asset using a pre-tax discount rate specific to the asset or cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs. Assets that do not have independent cash flows are grouped together to form a cash-generating unit.

Note 2. Significant accounting policies (continued)

Fair value measurement

When an asset or liability, financial or non-financial, is measured at fair value for recognition or disclosure purposes, the fair value is based on the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date; and assumes that the transaction will take place either: in the principal market; or in the absence of a principal market, in the most advantageous market.

Fair value is measured using the assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, assuming they act in their economic best interests. For non-financial assets, the fair value measurement is based on its highest and best use. Valuation techniques that are appropriate in the circumstances and for which sufficient data are available to measure fair value, are used, maximising the use of relevant observable inputs and minimising the use of unobservable inputs.

Leases

At inception of a contract, the Company assesses whether a contract is, or contains, a lease based on whether the contract conveys the right to control the use of an identified asset for a period of time in exchange for consideration.

The Company has elected to apply the practical expedient to account for each lease component and any non-lease components as a single lease component.

The Company recognises a right-of-use asset and a lease liability at the lease commencement date. The right-of-use asset is initially measured based on the initial amount of the lease liability adjusted for any lease payments made at or before the commencement date, plus any initial direct costs incurred and an estimate of costs to dismantle and remove the underlying asset or to restore the underlying asset or the site on which it is located, less any lease incentives received. The assets are depreciated to the earlier of the end of the useful life of the right-of-use asset or the lease term using the straight-line method as this most closely reflects the expected pattern of consumption of the future economic benefits. Lease terms are for 5 years for offices and IT equipment. In addition, the right-of-use asset is periodically reduced by impairment losses, if any, and adjusted for certain remeasurements of the lease liability.

The lease liability is initially measured at the present value of the lease payments that are not paid at the commencement date, discounted using the interest rate implicit in the lease or, if that rate cannot be readily determined, the Company's incremental borrowing rate. Generally, the Company uses its incremental borrowing rate as the discount rate. The lease liability is measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. It is remeasured when there is a change in future lease payments arising from a change in an index or rate, if there is a change in the Company's estimate of the amount expected to be payable under a residual value guarantee, or if the Company changes its assessment of whether it will exercise a purchase, extension or termination option. When the lease liability is remeasured in this way, a corresponding adjustment is made to the carrying amount of the right-of-use asset, or is recorded in profit or loss if the carrying amount of the right-of-use asset has been reduced to zero.

The Company has elected to apply the practical expedient not to recognise right-of-use assets and lease liabilities for short-term leases that have a lease term of 12 months or less and leases of low-value assets. The lease payments associated with these leases is recognised as an expense on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

Note 2. Significant accounting policies (continued)

Goods and Services Tax ('GST') and other similar taxes

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of associated GST, unless the GST incurred is not recoverable from the tax authority. In this case it is recognised as part of the cost of the acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the tax authority is included in other receivables or other payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to the tax authority, are presented as operating cash flows.

Commitments and contingencies are disclosed net of the amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the tax authority.

Members Guarantees

The Company is incorporated under the *Corporations Act 2001 (Cth)* and is a Company limited by guarantee. If the Company is wound up, the constitution states that each member (and each member that has left the Company within one year) is required to contribute a maximum \$10 each towards meeting any outstanding obligations of the Company. At 30 June 2022, the total amount that members of the Company are liable to contribute if the Company wound up is \$20 (2021: \$20).

Accounting policy for revenue recognition

The Company recognises revenue as follows:

Container Refund Scheme income

The Company as the Scheme Coordinator of the Scheme under the *Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery Act 2007 (WA)* ("the Act", enters into deeds with eligible First Responsible Suppliers to receive contributions to cover the costs of administering the scheme. Whilst these deeds represent an enforceable contract, the contributions received from First Responsible Suppliers fall under AASB 1058 Income of Not-for-Profit Entities, as there is no sufficiently specific promise specified in the separate deeds with First Responsible Suppliers to be delivered by the Scheme Coordinator. Revenue is recognised as the amount owed by relevant suppliers of beverage products under the terms of the Scheme. This is calculated upon the number of eligible containers sold into the Western Australia market during the financial year, as defined by the Act.

Note 3. Revenue (continued)

Sale of recycled goods

The Company, in its capacity as the Scheme Coordinator, sells processed containers through an online recycling material sales platform to approved recyclers. To determine whether and when to recognise revenue, the Company follows a five step process:

1. Identifying the contract with a customer – The auction process results in a binding contract between the Company and the recycler as the customer;
2. Identifying the performance obligations – The performance obligation is the goods for sale;
3. Determining the transaction price – The transaction price is the successful bid made by the recycler in addition to fees (if any) included in the agreement. The Scheme Coordinator makes no warranties or guarantees about the recycled goods hence there are no provisions or elements of variable consideration to be considered in determining the transaction price;
4. Allocating the transaction price to the performance obligations – The price is allocated directly to the sale; and
5. Recognising revenue when/as performance obligation(s) are satisfied – Revenue is recognised at the point in time at which the customer obtains control of a promised asset (i.e. the recycled goods). The Company has deemed this to be the point when the goods are available for collection by the customer as that is the point when the Company has a present right to payment.

Other revenue

Other revenue is recognised when it is received or when the right to receive payment is established.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised as interest accrues using the effective interest method. This is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial asset and allocating the interest income over the relevant period using the effective interest rate, which is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to the net carrying amount of the financial asset.

PUBLIC EDUCATION AND AWARENESS (A18)

The amount of funds spent by the coordinator on public education and awareness during the reporting period; a summary of actions taken to promote the CDS and refund point locations during the reporting period; and results of surveys undertaken on the level of public awareness about the CDS.

The total amount spent on advertising during the period 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022 was \$2,357,669.

The total amount spent on marketing activity (excluding advertising and including Business Development) during the period 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022 was \$2,697,231.

The marketing campaign Coin Rattle launched the scheme in October 2020 successfully positioned the value of the containers in the mind of WA consumers, as demonstrated in redemption rates and through consumer research.

In November 2020, a strategic review commenced and this work identified the organisation needed to focus on participation and enablement to drive redemption. The key to this was to focus on behaviour change and disrupt the current way of communicating the Scheme. This led to the development and launch of Don't Feed the Fill that drives an emotive connection for audience not driven by financial incentive and connection with a market context truth.

For this second year the focus continued on driving awareness through always on advertising and addressing the barriers of access and convenience. Don't Feed the Fill and a tactical campaign of Know your Local was promoted across linear TV, digital video, radio, outdoor, press, digital and social. This activity drove awareness, intention, and traffic to the Containers for Change website and refund points.

Success rate continues to be measured across a number of key metrics; redemption rates, prompted awareness, likelihood to use and advertising recall. In February 2022 Faster Horses Consultancy conducted an independent online qualitative research survey of 469 respondents. The results show a positive result for the second year goals.

KEY RESULTS FEBRUARY 2022:

- Prompted awareness year 85% - most well-known recycling program in WA
- Likelihood to use 83%
- 85% believe that recycling with Containers for Change will have a positive impact on the environment
- 77% of respondents state the campaign drove them to take action
- 96% of those surveyed say protection of the environment was the most compelling factor for people to return containers with Containers for Change. The 10c refund was second most compelling.

ANNUAL SUMMARY OF AUDITS (A23)

Annual summary of audits undertaken of first responsible suppliers to check that the number of containers that each first responsible supplier has declared to have supplied within the period is an accurate reflection of the actual number of containers supplied; and discrepancies between what first responsible suppliers have reported to the Coordinator, and the audit findings.

Two quarterly audit rounds have been completed – covering 20 first responsible suppliers. As a result of these audits, compliance notifications were sent to 8 suppliers.

Where supply volume variance was noted in the audit findings, the suppliers were directed through a written direction warning letter to remediate the issue and adjust their volumes accordingly – there were 10 notices provided in response to these audit findings. Variations and responses to these notices are actively being worked through.

Two first responsible suppliers did not cooperate with the audit program by supplying the required evidence in the required timeframes, these first responsible suppliers have also received a written direction warning letter to respond to this finding and have been flagged for further monitoring activity.

In September 2021 due to human error some LPB and HDPE containers were incorrectly disposed of to landfill by one of our processors (self-reported by the processor). As soon as the error was identified, WARRRL engaged with the processor to ensure all processing facilities implemented procedures to ensure clear identification, separation and accounting for CDS containers both prior to and post baling and sale of material to approved recyclers and communicated the incident and corrective actions to DWER. Following this incident, the specific site where the incident occurred implemented numerous operational changes as well as installing new signage to make identification, separation, and storage of CDS material clearer.

PERFORMANCE BREACHES OR NON-COMPLIANCES (A26)

WARRRL nominated a preliminary return rate target of 65% for the 2021/22 Financial Year under regulation 10. The return rate achieved is 60.62%.

The target rate was not achieved due to lower redemption achieved at both RPOs and MRFs during the year. WARRRL continues to explore every avenue to increase redemption including marketing to influencing disposal behaviour, increase participation and recycling, increasing access to the Scheme including introduction of more refund point depots, kiosks and bag drops as well as exchange points at public places. Glass redemption levels are performing best of the material types whilst PET redemption is slowly improving with the lower redemption rates appearing to be influenced by its consumption nature largely being 'on the go' and away from home and at locations with limited immediate recycling options (landfill bins are often the only available option).
