CORRECTION NOTICE

Regulation 3 of the Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery (Container Deposit Scheme) Regulations 2019 (the Regulations) defines the Reporting Code as a document which sets out the information that the coordinator is required to include on the scheme's website or in a report.

The Reporting code outlines the annual and quarterly reporting requirements for the coordinator. One of these annual requirements is A11.

A11 requires WARRRL to report on destination (overseas, interstate, local) of collected or returned containers for each material type for the reporting period in metric tonnes.

WARRRL prepared and published the reports as per the requirements of the reporting code. However, it has now become evident that 0.89mt of other materials were not reported under their own material type due to the volume involved and the ease of processing in adding them to existing materials reported every year.

A11 reported:

Year	Total materials per metric tonne

The other material amounted to 0.89m/t made up of:

- Polypropylene (PP)
- Casks
- Pouches

Casks and Pouches were always included with the Liquid Paper Board (LPB) and some were shipped to Spain while a small percentage was shipped to an Australian recycler based in NSW.

Polypropylene was recycled in WA.

WARRRL has now extended its reporting procedures to include other materials, which will allow WARRRL to report this in FY26 and future years.
